Trustee Appointment



<u>Uniform</u>

Equally, our uniform policy extends to coats, bags and our indoor and outdoor PE kit.

Earrings and Hairstyles

May I remind you that jewellery is generally not permitted. Those with pierced ears should remove them for school but if this is not possible, only small studs should be worn that are unobtrusive.

Equally extreme haircuts and tramlines are not permitted and may result in children being sent home.

Mobile Phones

Please may I remind parents of the need to follow our rules on the use of mobile phones in school which are clearly displayed on the window in Reception. After all, it is for the safety of all our children.

After School Club

We would like to remind you that for the nursery children and the children who stay in After School Club the afternoon meal provided is not a substitute for a proper evening meal. It is purely a 'light snack' to provide a little sustenance at the end of their busy day.

Similar to last summer, we are holding an Olympic week in school during week commencing 12th June and you will receive further information on this and sports day in due course.

Last terms averaged House Credit Scores were as follows:

Coming up we have 2 fixtures for cricket, more football and netball. In addition, I am hoping to run some inter-house competitions in readiness of Prize Night.

Extra-Curricular Activities

Yasmin Chambers from Rattle and Roll continues to come into school to teach dance on a Friday as well as offering private ballet lessons for those who may be interested. Equally there are many other clubs on offer across the school including football, board games, and a nurture group. Archery and Chess also continue as does Running Club. A new Recorder Club has just started up and private piano lessons are available through Ed, our peripatetic Music Teacher.

Shakespeare Week

As part of World Book day, many of the children dressed as characters from the works of William Shakespeare. This was to complement work in class and to highlight his appeal to all ages and backgrounds.

Children in Need

This year's Children in Need appeal raised £114.51. Thank you to all who donated to this worthwhile cause.

Assessments

As an Independent School, we have declined to take part in National Testing (SATs) this year. However, we do intend to informally test some of our Year 6 pupils to act as a benchmark and aide professional development. This will help ensure teaching and learning remains competitive and of the highest quality.

Beyond St Joseph's

We were very proud to learn that all our Year 6 leavers obtained places at the schools to which they applied. Four children are going to the High School, one to the Becket in West Bridgford, two to Hollygirt and one to Ratcliffe College.

Well done and we wish them well.

Other News

Our IT suite has now been upgraded with 12 new towers all running Windows 10 Pro, which will enhance the children's online experience and subsequent learning.

A residential visit for the junior school to PGL at Grantham, or Robin Wood in West Yorkshire in October is being proposed depending on interest. Further details to follow.
