Head Teacher's Newsletter November 2015

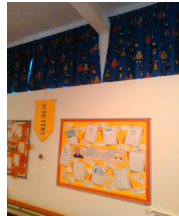
Dear Parents and Carers

New Uniform

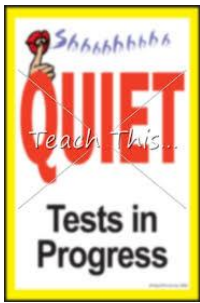

Progress Tests

Notification Of Absences

Cathedral Parking

Please do not park in the cathedral courtyard car park as this is private and may result in a fine or short term lock in. If you need a short term street parking permit, please ask at reception.



Lost Property

As in every school lost property is a huge problem. Please ensure all clothing is labelled and that no valuables are brought in as we cannot accept responsibility for them. Please also note that unclaimed property will be sent to charity at the end of each term.

Violence to staff

Please note, whilst we pride ourselves in being an open and approachable school, we do operate a non-aggression policy towards staff including zero tolerance to verbal and physical intimidation. Any member of the public or school community who does not respect this will be asked to leave the premises and further action may be taken depending on the nature of the abuse.

Helpers in School

We always appreciate the help of additional adults in our school. If you are able to help on a regular basis would you kindly contact your child's class teacher. Please note that for child protection purposes, the government has decreed that all adults working unsupervised regularly with children, whether volunteers or not must have appropriate safety checks carried out. There is a small administration charge to the individual for these checks and are essential to maintain safety in school. Also, please be aware that some activities such as interschool sports fixtures can only take place with the support of parents. For this reason, I would urge you to embrace the checks and volunteer to help the school.
